

Section 8.7 Shoeing Definitions and the USDA Ruling as of July 1, 1989: For the purpose of defining “Flat Shod” and “Open Shod” the following descriptions are offered:

A. SHOEING RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR ALL FLAT SHOD DIVISIONS

- (5) In all classes designated as light shod, the shoe must not exceed  $\frac{3}{8}$  of an inch in thickness, nor be wider than  $\frac{3}{4}$  of an inch. The caulk must not be any thicker than  $\frac{3}{4}$  of an inch.

A. SHOEING RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR ALL FLAT SHOD DIVISIONS

- (5) In all classes designated as light shod, the shoe must not exceed  $\frac{1}{2}$  of an inch in thickness, nor be wider than 1 inch. The caulk must not be any thicker than 1 inch.
