A WORD FROM OUR PRESIDENT

The world is a bit different now, and we have been working hard here at the RHBAA to adapt. First I must thank everyone that helped support the Spring Celebration that was held in July. To say it was a success is an understatement. If you weren't there you missed one the best shows that the RHBAA has put on. We had great morale and I think everyone was excited to see each other again. We will be keeping the same structure from the July show for this upcoming World Celebration this September.

We are encouraging social distancing and the use of masks during this pandemic for the health and safety of all of those involved. Our breed office will remain closed to the public but we will have the window in the lobby to use if needed. Although we will not be able to set up box seats this year due to the pandemic, we now have a better deal for everyone. We have decided on a jackpot payback system for the line classes this year due to the lack of sponsorships. The Stake classes will still be paid out the same and the Specialty Action Championship Stake will be double payout for the prize money this year. We know these aren't popular decisions to make but we felt these moves were the best to help the breed in the long run. We have tried to ensure that you will still have many chances to show your horse.

One exciting change we know you'll like is the addition of a new division for the speed horse called Country Speed. We will be trying this out for the first time at the Celebration. We have included the rules for this new division in this packet. Please let us know if you have any questions about it.



We know it's hard to spend your money right now so we feel responsible to provide the best experience for you, your family and your horse this year. Again, we've made some changes, some unfortunate, but necessary, and some exciting, but one thing that never will change is our love of this breed.

We look forward to another great show!

***172. WORLD GRAND CHAMPIONSHIP

Country Speed Division

- 1. The Country Speed Horse shall be shown where both horse and rider are relaxed and comfortable. The horse shall be required to maintain a head set and be alert in the bridle. He shall not be required to maintain a high front leg lift, but should exhibit a smooth stride behind. The Country Speed Horse does not sacrifice style for speed and is purposed to be less than the Open Speed Horse division. The Country Speed Horse will not show signs of straining but will be performing a natural gait that isn't forced and is more collected than the normal speed horse division. The gait is highly recognized while being judged and is very important that the horse has a smooth and natural four beat gait that never paces or trots while being shown. The Country Speed Horse will be required to perform three gaits: (1) Country Speed Brisk Walk, (2) Country Speed Slow Rack and (3) Country Speed Fast Rack. The Country Speed horse shall stand quietly and must back readily. The tack and attire for Country Speed may be either English or Western but not a combination of both.
- 2. The Country Speed Brisk Walk Horse must exhibit a brisk walk, but not a show walk, be alert in the bridle, well collected and controlled. This gait would be a desired on a trail as a natural walk and the horse shall remain relaxed and collected.
- 3. The Country Speed Slow Rack shall be a true four-beat gait, horse must exhibit a slow, smooth, be alert and collected in the bridle. There will be no evidence of strain on the part of the horse or rider. The reins shall be held lightly.
- 4. The Country Speed Fast Rack shall be a comfortable, easy-going rack in which speed is encouraged but style and gait should not be sacrificed. The gait should be easily distinguished from the other two gaits required of this division; there shall be a smooth stride behind and a natural rolling motion up front. Any indication of strain on the part of horse or rider will be penalized.
- 5. The Country Speed horse shall enter the ring at a Country Speed Slow Rack prior to initial judging of the class. Three gaits shall be called for, beginning with the Country Speed Brisk Walk, after all entries have entered the ring horses are prepared to be judged.
- 6. Shoeing requirements: The shoe must not exceed ½" in thickness, nor be wider than 1". Drill tech and borium are allowed on the bottom of the shoe. The shoe must be hoof to shoe with no pad in between. Refer to Section 8.7A (5), page 32 of the Rule Book.
- 7. Severe bits must be penalized in the final judging. Shanks over nine- and one-half inches (9 ½") are prohibited. Gag bits without shanks are not allowed. Shanks are measured from the top to the very bottom of the metal, including the rings. In this division, whips, crops and cross-chain cavessons are prohibited. Cavessons are permitted in Western and English.
- 8. Horses competing in Country Speed Division are not eligible to compete in any other divisions. This division shall be open only to Amateurs and Juveniles.

Notice to All Exhibitors You <u>MUST</u> be a member to Show at World Celebration!

- *****There will be a charge per horse of \$130.00 as a one-time charge for World Celebration. This charge does not include your entry fee nor you're parking fee, but may include a stall fee if you choose to stay on the Arena Grounds. You will need to report horse name and registration number to entry office.
- *If you choose to use a stall, you must make a reservation. Should no stalls be available you are still required to pay the upfront charges for your horse to show.
- *****Effective August 1st, 2015 the Board of Directors voted to begin implementing a new policy of collecting a 3% charge on all charge card transactions. We feel this move is necessary to offset the escalating expense we have in offering this service.
- *Trainer, Owner and Rider must be a member of the RHBAA.
- *All Exhibitor Cards, Trainer, Amateur and Juvenile, must be current and shown at the time of entering a class.
- *Proper Registration numbers must be presented at the time of entry. Pending will not be accepted.

 If you have a horse that has not had DNA verified, that horse will not be allowed to show. You must provide proof of DNA and/or pull hair on the show grounds to begin the DNA process.
- *Tabs can be set-up in entry office for all entries with check or credit card. All other items must be paid for at the time of service in the RHBAA Office.
- *RHBAA takes Visa or Master Charge Cards Only.
- *NO Prize money or awards will be given if a horse/pony fails to pass inspection after tying in a class.
- *All horses shown in aged division will be mouthed, including horses shown in the Classic Horse Classes. Each horse will be assigned an official card indicating the age of the horse.
- *Horses providing proof of mouthing will not have to be re-mouthed.
- *Negative Coggins and an EHV-1 Vaccine required. This is not to be taken lightly, and will be required in order to pull horses onto the grounds.
- *If entered in Ladies Auxiliary and Juvenile Auxiliary classes you must comply with all rules of said organization.
- *Horses that meet all registration requirements and are registered during Celebration will be eligible to enter and show in their classes.
- *All Juvenile Exhibitors in the Speed Classes must wear a helmet.
- *"Novice" Article X Section 10.2: (f) Novice.
- *Line Classes will be Jackpot: Winners of Class will receive prorated portion of entry fees paid to enter class, through 6th place. Scale is based on number of entries in class. See attached example of line classes.

Other Important Things You Need To Know

HORSE REGISTRATION:

Registration number and complete registered name of horse must be given at time of entry. Each horse must be registered in the name of present owner on the Celebration date to be eligible for exhibition. **Trainer**, **Owner**, and **Rider must be a member of the RHBAA**. All entry forms must be correct and complete, including social security number and signature of person receiving winnings. Stables and farms cannot be listed as trainer.

BACK NUMBER CHANGES:

We have received a request from the USDA for specific information to be added to our DQP reports. In light of the information you will need to assign each horse a back number. The back number will no longer be attached to the rider. Each horse will need its own back number. Lifetime back numbers may be used for the one horse of your choosing. The Lifetime back numbers will be provided at the Spring Celebration for the current show season.

MEASUREMENTS:

All 15.2 and 54" to 60" horses and ponies must be measured no later than one half hour before performance. Animals that are measured out of classes may enter an appropriate class if one is available on the remaining schedule. In no case will refunds be made for animals disqualified by being measured out of the class originally entered. Measurements are done by SHOW HIO, DQP's during inspection.

PROMPT ENTRANCE TO RING:

Due notice will be served upon all exhibitors as to the time classes will be called, and all horses must be ready and waiting so that they may enter the ring promptly. When the gates are closed upon any class and the judges have started to work, no exhibitor who is late will be admitted to the ring.

COMMISSIONERS AND OFFICIALS:

Commissioners will be available on the show grounds to examine and qualify horses meeting requirements for registration. Officials will be on hand to complete the registration. All horses approved and registered during the Celebration will be eligible for showing in their respective classes. Approved applications must be turned in to the entry office at the time of entry.

REFUNDS:

No refunds will be made when a horse or pony is withdrawn by an exhibitor for any reason other than that of illness, and this reason must be substantiated by a certificate from an Official Veterinarian, at time of scratch. No refunds are made on entries which fail to pass the Stewards inspection station. The Celebration reserves the right to decline any entry and to return any fee before or during the show without being liable for compensation.

DISQUALIFICTION:

Any entry or entries considered by the judges or committee to be in any undesirable, untrained, unfit, or improperly turned out may be disqualified from any class or from the show.

VETERINARY EXAMS:

Horses must be serviceably sound in order to show in any class or classes. Any dispute as to age, height, or soundness of horses will be referred to an Official Veterinarian who will be furnished by the Celebration, and whose decision shall be final. Any entry not having been checked by DQP prior to entering the ring will be charged with a 5-minute time out.

CHALLENGE TROPHIES:

All challenge trophies must be retained in the Racking Horse Breeders' Association of America office. Prior arrangements must be made with the Racking Horse Celebration Arena (256) 353-7225 for all Challenge Trophies presentations.

QUALIFICATIONS:

Horses entered and shown in preliminary qualifying classes (classes with an *beside them) will be eligible, according to age of exhibitor, to compete in their respective stake or championship classes. Exhibitor must declare at time of entry the stake or championship class for which he/she is qualifying the horse.

RESPONSIBILITY:

Neither the Racking Horse World Celebration nor the Racking Horse Breeders' Association of America shall be held responsible for loss incurred or damage caused to horses exhibited or animals, person, vehicles, or articles brought or sent to the Celebration.

SPORTSMANSHIP:

The management reserves the right to disbar from competition, by immediate expulsion from the arena, any exhibitor displaying unsportsmanlike conduct:

Each exhibitor is encouraged to practice safe horsemanship at all times on the shows grounds.

REQUEST FROM THE HORSE SHOW COMMITTEE:

The enforcement of the rules for the warm-up area has become a necessity to eliminate the number of spectators in the warm-up area.

Trainers, grooms and exhibitors must show respect to judges during the show. Please refrain from calling a judge by name.

Please show respect to the ribbon presenter by exhibiting a show walk to receive the ribbon. You may step your horse up when exiting the ring only after receiving your ribbon and are well clear of the ribbon presenter.
